Timelines

Overview

Timelines are a resource we use in different parts of our lives to understand events and their cause and effect. This lesson can be taught separately or used as part of a Heritage Unit. Students will demonstrate an understanding of chronological order of historical events.

Overview

Students will understand the chronological organization of history and know how to organize events and people into major eras to identify and explain historical relations by;

- Chronologically organizing significant events, groups, and people in local history.
- Creating timelines that show people and events in sequence.

Materials

3" x 5" index cards, enough for each student to have 8-10. Construction paper to record events.

Teacher generated blank timelines for each student.

Assessment(s)

Students will complete a written timeline of historical local events provided by the teacher with no relevant date attached to events.

Prerequisite Skills

Knowledge of ordinal numbers and concepts of first, second, etc. Knowledge of local history.

Instructional Strategies

- Whole class creates a list of local historic events in chronological order.
- Write events on paper for students to hold up in the front of the class.
- Class helps to place the events in order by rearranging students.
- Individuals write historic events on 3"x5" cards with no date on the card.
- Partners help each other to place their event cards in order.
- Teacher gives thirty historical events with the dates for students to write on 3"x5" cards.
- Insert historical cards in the correct chronological position.
- Individuals write their dates and historical events from their cards on a blank timeline in correct order to hand in.
- Discuss methods or strategies students used to figure out the correct order.

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Discussion

Students will discuss and provide reasoning for the placement of events in the selected order.
